AN ACT APPROPRIATING FUNDS OF THE STATE TO PLACE A PLAQUE OR OTHER SUITABLE MARKER ON MOUNT FRISSELL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

That the sum of ten thousand dollars be appropriated to the Department of Environmental Protection, from the General Fund, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, for the purpose of placing a bronze plaque or other suitable marker on the top of Mount Frissell recognizing it as the highest point in Connecticut.

Statement of Purpose:

To recognize Mount Frissell as the highest point in Connecticut.
