TOWN ADOPTS STATE BUILDING CODE

BE IT ORDAINED That the Town of Salisbury hereby adopts the State Building Code, Chapter #354 of the General Statutes of the State of Connecticut effective September 10, 1970 - (Amended June 23, 1972)

RESOLVED, That an amendment to the ordinance adopted September 10, 1970 to provide penalties for violations to implement sections 122.3 and 123.2 of the Connecticut State Building Code be made as follows:

1. Any person who shall violate a provision of the State Building Code or shall fail to comply with any of the requirements thereof or shall erect, construct, alter or repair a building or structure in violation of any approved plan or directive of the building official, or of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of the Code shall be guilty of misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment not exceeding one (1) year, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.
2. Any person who shall continue any work in or about the building after having been served with a stop order, except such work as he is directed to perform to remove a violation of unsafe conditions, shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$25 or more than \$100. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.

GIVES SELECTMEN AUTHORITY TO AMEND AND ADOPT SCHEDULES OF FEES FOR PERMITS & SERVICES

BE IT ORDAINED That the Selectmen are hereby authorized and empowered to adopt and amend schedules of fees for the permits and services;

- (a) for the Building Inspector in administering the State Building Code;
- (b) for the Sanitary Inspector or Sanitarian in administering the Sewage System Ordinance for individual and the Connecticut Public Health Code; and
- (c) in conjunction with the Planning and Zoning Commission, for the Zoning Administrators in administering the Commission's regulations.

No. 30      March 9, 1972 - PASSED AND APPROVED AT TOWN MEETING  
Amended by Ordinance #69 - January 20, 1989

RESOLVED, That there is hereby established a Salisbury Conservation Commission for the development, supervision, and regulation of natural resources including water resources, within the territorial limits of the Town, such Commission shall have the powers and duties set forth in Section 7-131A of the Connecticut General Statutes.

Under adoption of this ordinance, the First Selectman shall appoint three members of such Salisbury Conservation Commission to serve until the next succeeding biennial election of the Town and four members to serve until the

second succeeding biennial election. The First Selectman shall, at the time of each biennial election of the Town, appoint members to serve terms of four years to fill vacancies caused by expired terms of members of the Commission,

NORTHWEST REGIONAL PLANNING AGENCY

RESOLVED, That the Town of Salisbury adopts provisions of Sections S-31a to S-37a of the Connecticut General Statutes for the purpose of creating or joining a Regional Planning Agency, to be designated as the Northwest Regional Planning Agency. The Selectmen of the Town of Salisbury shall appoint one member of said Northwest Regional Planning Agency to serve until the next succeeding biennial election of the Town or until his successor shall have been appointed and shall have qualified. Thereafter, the selectmen shall at the time of each biennial election of the Town appoint a member thereof to serve until the next succeeding biennial election of the Town or until his successor shall have been duly appointed and qualified.

REGULATING THE LICENSING AND OPERATION OF  
FOOD-SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS, FOOD CATERING SERVICES  
AND ITINERANT FOOD-VENDING BUSINESSES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town of Salisbury that the following Ordinance be enacted:

"An Ordinance Regulating the Licensing and Operation of Food-Vending Establishments, Food Catering Services and Itinerant Food-Vending Businesses"

SECTION 1 DEFINITIONS

Approved - "Approved" shall mean acceptable to the Director of Health following his determination as to conformance with appropriate standards and good public health practice.

Director of Health - "Director of Health" shall mean the Director of Health of the Town of Salisbury or his authorized representative.

Employee - "Employee" shall mean any person working in a food vending establishment who transports food or food containers, who engages in food preparation or service, or who comes in contact with any eating or cooking utensils or equipment, or who is employed in a room in which food or drink is prepared or served. The term "employee" shall include both paid and unpaid, full-time and part-time workers.

Equipment - "Equipment" shall mean all stoves, ranges, hoods, meat blocks, tables, counters, refrigerators, sinks, dishwashing machines, steam tables or other similar items other than "utensils" used in the operation of a food service establishment.

Food - "Food" shall mean any raw, cooked or processed edible substance, beverage, or ingredient used or intended for use in whole, or in part for human consumption.

Food Catering Service - "Food Catering Service" shall mean any operation in which food or drink is prepared at one location for sale or for service at a different
